5. Pauatahanui Village Planning Programme

Anna provided verbal reports on the following projects, which were **noted** by the Committee:

#### **Rubbish bins**

Pauatahanui School children presented ideas to Mayor Leggett, with support of the PRA, to assist with the control of rubbish in the village.

The children's ideas for the style and location of the new rubbish bins have been taken up through the Pauatahanui Village Planning Programme and will be installed during March.

#### Rotary Grays Road carpark tidy up

PCC and Rotary are working to prepare the ground near the Grays Road/Paekakariki Hill Road corner ready for the installation of grass-cell blocks to tidy it up and make it suitable for parking.

#### **Historic Trail**

Anna has developed information for a first panel in the historic trail. Claire Giblin of PCC is working with Laureen Sadlier and designer Stuart Forsyth from Pataka to set up a meeting and push the project ahead for this financial year.

#### Safety Barrier on intersection of SH58 and Joseph Banks Drive

PCC and NZTA have discussed safety options and NZTA have identified this project as a priority. NZTA will take this project forward given the area is a State Highway. The NZTA proposed option for barrier design is metal piping and pool panels constructed to minimize damage if struck by a car.

#### Safety in the Village

Anna indicated she would like to undertake some research into safety, including traffic issues in the village. This will require discussions with a number of interested parties.

The Committee thanked Anna for this offer and **agreed** this was worth her pursuing.

	Moonshine Road Safety						
	PCC has recently commissioned a traffic safety review of Moonshine Road by David Wanty, Traffic consultant, in response to a number of concerns that have been raised. Donald Love shared the report with PRA and asked for PRA's opinion. Following some discussion the key points (with acknowledgement that the committee only had a brief opportunity to consider the matter) are:

- That the recommendations of the report (as outlined in the Conclusion) appear to be an appropriate outcome.
- It was noted that many of the issues raised (road maintenance, vegetation, drainage, signage) are common to all the local roads – Flightys, Mulhern, Belmont etc. There was also acknowledgement that there are some differences e.g. Flightys and Moonshine have the logging trucks currently, Moonshine and Paekakariki have the school buses, Flightys will have traffic associated with Transmission Gully etc
- The committee felt that it does take up opportunities to address the common, broader issues with the Council e.g. through the LTCP
- The committee did not feel in a position to comment on the specific issues and

	<ul> <li>there was the general feeling that these need to be taken up by those most affected i.e. the road users.</li> <li>However, in acknowledgement of the level of concern that has been raised a brief survey will be circulated to the Moonshine community/road users to help PRA better understand the key issues and priorities for those using the road.</li> </ul>
