



# Overview

Gifted learners are a group of learners with additional support needs: learning, social and emotional, within the context of their giftedness (NAG 1 (c) iii & (d), Learning Support Plan). The professional learning and development needs of educators and those with Coordination responsibility are high in this area but competing priorities and busy workloads result in many educators being time poor.

At NZCGE we aim to provide PLD that is responsive to educators' needs. What we provide is unique in that it draws not just from our own expertise and formal learning in this field but our extensive experience in working with gifted learners.

The Spotlight Series is developed in response to the needy but busy educator or coordinator who can manage bite-sized chunks of learning in an online environment. Each Spotlight is a building block to the bigger picture of understanding, identifying and supporting giftedness.
