has been phenomenal. With our aim being to make a difference in our community the opportunity to work with like-minded people, and other service organisations makes the role so much easier and very rewarding.

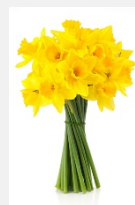
Learning what is actually going on in our community has been another eye-opener, so this makes the rewards of being involved even greater.

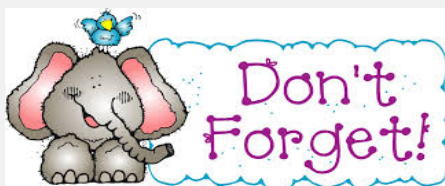


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Virtuoso Strings: Carolyn Wallace has been meeting with Liz. They need practical help such as:

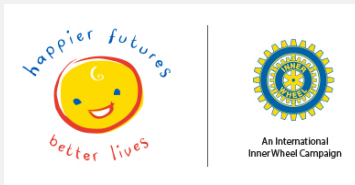
